










Thirty Second Guide to Making an iPhoto Slide Show (and Publishing it on the Plasma Screen)

- **Import pictures from your camera into iPhoto**

If you want to:	Do this:
Import images from a digital camera	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plug the camera into your computer using the USB cable that came with the camera. • Click IMPORT. All of the pictures on the camera will be imported into iPhoto.
Import images from a CD, external drive, or desktop.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Under FILE in the iPhoto menu bar, drag to IMPORT TO LIBRARY and select the images you wish to add. • Drag the image into the EVENTS or PHOTO window in iPhoto.
Create a SlideShow	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (If the Slide Show icon is not on the bottom menu bar of iPhoto, click on VIEW / SHOW IN TOOLBAR / SLIDESHOW)  • Choose an EVENT  • Click the SlideShow Icon.
Adjust Images	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rotate, Crop, or Straighten----->  • Enhance settings, eliminate Red Eye, or remove blemishes by clicking on :  • Add special effects or manually adjust image settings by clicking on : 
Adjust Show Settings	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Click the Settings Icon and adjust the settings shown:  • Click the Music Icon to add or remove music from the show.  • To view the show, click the Play icon on the Bottom Menu bar  
Publish or Plasma Screen Viewing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make sure you in the Slideshow view. • Select all slides by clicking Apple / A. • Under FILE, drag to EXPORT. • Title the movie and add .mov to the end i.e. <i>mymovie.mov</i> • Choose <i>Movie Size / Large</i>. • Contact EJ for uploading help.
